NOSEBAND PROTECTORS NEEDED

As supporters of Nowzad Dogs we know how much you already care about the dogs and cats of Afghanistan and Iraq.

The time has come now for us to move forward and also look towards helping the donkeys and horses of Afghanistan and Iraq and to provide education for the owners of the animals.

Horses and Donkeys are used widely as working animals in these countries but all too often they will suffer painful injuries caused by poorly fitting head collars and harnesses that are made from chains.

We can help prevent these injuries by providing simple, homemade fabric covers that fit over the chains making them more comfortable for the animal to wear and preventing injury. The more colourful the better!



So, how can you help us to help them?

WSPA have kindly given us a pattern that can be used to make low cost nosebands.

These nosebands can be made for next to nothing in just a few minutes using any suitable spare fabric you may have lying around at home. They only take a few minutes to make and can be mailed to us at Nowzad Dogs where they will then be distributed to the horse and donkey owners in Afghanistan and Iraq.

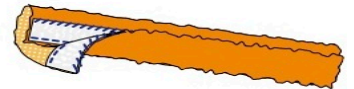
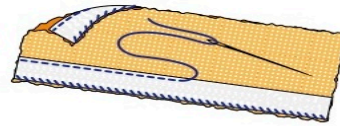
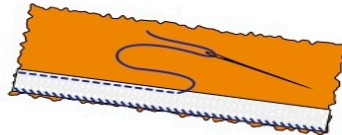
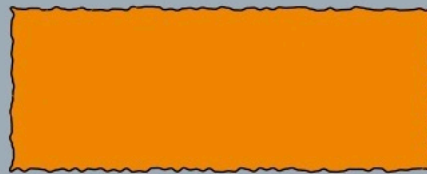
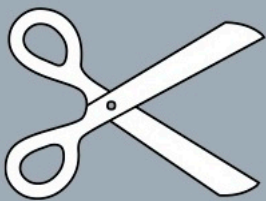


How to make Noseband Protectors

It's very easy to make a noseband protector and it doesn't take long to do. You don't even have to be good at sewing to make one.

To make a noseband protector you need the following:

- Soft, thick fabric – ideally fun fur
- Sew-on Velcro
- Fabric scissors
- Thread
- Needle or sewing machine
- Ruler



1 Cut the fabric into a piece 11 inches (28.5cm) by 4 inches (10cm) and cut the Velcro into an 11 inch (28cm) length. This will make one noseband protector – repeat if you are making more.

2 Sew one Velcro strip onto the inside length of the fabric. Please sew on the Velcro as glue quickly deteriorates in the heat.

3 Turn the fabric over and sew the other Velcro strip onto the outside length of the fabric.

4 Roll the fabric into a tube by sticking the two Velcro strips together. The tube makes a cover that can easily be put on and taken off nosebands.
